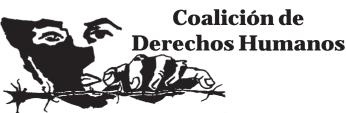

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Know Your Rights!

If you are arrested: you may be handcuffed, searched, photographed, and fingerprinted. You have the right to remain silent, but you must identify yourself. Do not offer excuses or explanations. Anything you say can be used against you. Just say, "I want to talk to my lawyer." If you don't have a lawyer, ask the police how you can contact one. Do not talk to anybody about your case.

If the police want to search you, your car, or home: Say repeatedly that you **DO NOT** consent to the search. If they say they have a search warrant, ask to see it. They can pat you down if they have reason to believe you are armed and involved in a crime.

If you are driving: You must show your license, registration, and proof of insurance. If you are suspected of drinking and driving and you refuse to take a breath test, your license can be suspended.

If you are the victim of police abuse: Write down details of the incident immediately (official's name, vehicle #, witness' phone #'s). Document injuries and get a medical report as soon as possible.

WHAT IS AN ABUSE?

Being detained without explanation Discriminated against due to age, race, or appearance Treated rudely, insulted, or threatened Deprived of basic necessities (water, food, medical attention, etc.) A victim of excessive force or physical abuse A victim of a neighborhood sweep Being sexually harassed or raped

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
